A Space Designed for Inspiration

Last summer, ATA transformed Rosewood's music room into a space that fosters creativity and calm. The newly renovated classroom now features a mindfulness corner and a live music stage, giving students a beautiful and functional space to explore music. This renovation aligns with our curriculum that acknowledges the mind-body-spirit connection we have with music, incorporating mindfulness and body awareness into every lesson.

Music Every Week

Thanks to ATA's support, every student from TK through 5th grade receives consistent, highquality music instruction with a full-time music educator. From the earliest grades, students are immersed in a world of sound and learning through:

- Singing and movement
- Piano, ukulele, and percussion
- Exposure to genres like classical, jazz, blues, multicultural music, and musical theatre

Our curriculum is culturally diverse and designed to help build skills that benefit children academically, emotionally, and socially—the exact approach we foster at Rosewood and expanded to our Coachella Valley schools.

Time for Growth

These formative years are critical for children. Music education:

- Increases cognitive function and improves whole brain health
- Builds social skills including empathy, teamwork, and emotional intelligence
- Increases self-confidence

At our adopted schools, music is more than a class—it's a vital part of nurturing the whole child and setting students up for bright, successful futures.

A Stage for Every Student

Each class performs multiple times a year in vocal showcases for friends and family in the school auditorium. The program also highlights cultural celebrations through performances during Hispanic Heritage Month and Black History Month.





The Changels

The Changels ("Angels of Change") are an honor choir of 85 diverse elementary school students across five Adopt the Arts schools in Southern California. The Changels use choral music to bring people together, sharing a message of unity, learning songs from a wide variety of genres and performing for local and national audiences.

The Changels perform at festivals and celebrity events across Southern California, serving as proud ambassadors of Adopt the Arts. In preparation for live performances the Changels work with renowned Emmy-nominated choreographer Jennifer Hamilton and "So You Think You Can Dance" past contestant Carly Blaney.









A True Rock & Roll Fantasy

Adopt the Arts students have been busy making musical memories this spring! In April, select members of the Changels were invited to audition for the opportunity of a lifetime when they joined rock legend Paul Rodgers of Bad Company in a professional recording session at Good Noise studio in Palm Springs. Under the co-production guidance of our founder Matt Sorum and accomplished musician Bruce Witkin, the students recorded a special rendition of the Bad Company classic, "Rock & Roll Fantasy." This collaboration not only provided students with hands-on recording experience but was also filmed as part of our ongoing project showcasing the impact of music education.

"Music has the power to transform lives – I've experienced it myself and seen it countless times throughout my career," said Paul Rodgers. "Working with these young, talented and very engaged singers is an opportunity to pass along not just technical knowledge, but the passion, joy and spirit that comes from musical expression."
